Banke Bihari Mandir, Vrindavan

The name Banke and Bihari has two separate meanings, where Banke means Bent in three places and Bihari means 'enjoyer'. Due the position of his body while playing flute he has given this name by his beloved devotees. Banke Bihari Mandir, located in Vrindavan has a great significance among the Krishna devotees. It is one of seven temples of Krishna in Vrindavan near the Shri Radha Vallabh Temple. That is why it is one among the **5 Popular Temples to visit in Mathura and Vrindavan** in the list.

Nidhivan Temple, Vrindavan

Surrounded by the beauty of Mother Nature, Nidhivan Temple looks alluring and the air there feels blessed. Surrounded by many trees where some of the branches tangled to each other. And some of the branches of the trees or faced downwards. Here the local people believe that they are Gopis. Known to be as the queens of Sri Krishna. After sun sets no one is allowed to stay back here. As it is touted that Krishna and Radha along with the Gopis perform Raas-Leela in the Nidhivan. Here residents after evening close their door and windows. And no one goes outside till evening as the devotees respect this saying. Which is being followed from thousand years. It is believed that whosoever enters the forest after sunset either goes blind, deaf or dumb. But there are no proofs of such incidents.

Shri Krishna Janmbhoomi Temple, Mathura

Shri Krishna Janmbhoomi Temple has great significance among all the devotees. This sacred space is touted to be the birthplace of Krishna Bhagwan. As per our holy and authentic scriptures this place was the Kaaragaar that is prison of Kansa, uncle of Lord Krishna. Who has put his beloved sister and brother-in-law behind the bars after the celestial announcement. That he would be killed by the child of his sister and hence he killed all the 6 children of Devaki (Mother of Lord Krishna and sister of Kansa). But Krishna was taken secretly by his father, Vasudeva to Vrindavan. He gave the little child to his brother Nand, to save him from Kansa. But after the great grand son of Krishna took the responsibility, he turned this into an enticing Temple for the devotees of Kanhiya. Hence, this place becomes a must to visit space among

Dwarkadhish Temple, Mathura

A magnificent beauty and a distinguished place, Dwarkadhish Temple is situated in Mathura. Known to be the oldest temples of Mathura, the architectural beauty of this temple will leave you spell bounded. Dwarkadhish Temple is located near the Gatashrama and Vishram Ghat. The main shrine here is of Radharani Maa and lord Krishna. The idol of Dwarkadhish can be seen as of jet-black colour and the idol of Radharani Maa is of pure white colour. The pillars and the rooftop of the temple are carved with the idols of lord Krishna.

Chamunda Devi Temple, Mathura
